


Naviance in Our Schools



IGETC Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum is a series of courses that California community college students can complete to satisfy most freshman/sophomore-level general education requirements before transferring to CSU/UCs



Key Goal: College & Career Access Pathways (CCAP)

- Partnership (via an MOU) between the school district and the community college
- Goals/Purpose:
 - Offer dual and/or concurrent enrollment opportunities for all students but especially for those who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education
 - Develop seamless pathways from high school for CTE or transfer programs
 - Help all high school students achieve college & career readiness goals
